## LACEY ACT DECLARATION 2010

The Lacey Act (16 U.S.C §3371 et seq.) as amended makes it unlawful to import, export, transport, sell, receive, acquire, or purchase in interstate or foreign commerce any plant, with some limited exceptions, taken, possessed, transported or sold in violation of the laws of the United States, a State, an Indian tribe, or any foreign law that protects plants. In addition to requiring an import declaration for covered imported plant material, the Lacey Act applies to covered timber and plant materials that are taken from Federal land, Indian land, State land, or private land within the U.S. and then entered into interstate or foreign commerce.

Although no explicit recordkeeping requirements are imposed by the Lacey Act upon Clearwater Paper, the company obtains copies of import declarations from suppliers for covered foreign plant material. In addition, our Procurement Departments maintain records that track our fiber sources and monitor forestry practices. Clearwater Paper's Pulp and Paperboard Division also maintains Chain of Custody Certification through The Forest Stewardship Council.<sup>1</sup> Procurement records, along with the FSC Chain of Custody Certification, are tools that allow us to monitor our suppliers' compliance with applicable harvesting laws to verify compliance with the Lacey Act.
